Flowers greenish-white, small, on short stems above aerial bulblets (Wax, Fawcett and Isely 1981).

allium: Possibly from the Latin word for garlic or the Celtic word all 'pungent' or 'burning'

Reproduction

Seeds black, flat on one side, about 3mm long; formed only occasionally (Wax, Fawcett and Isely 1981).

Dienereal

Dispersed by vertebrates and possibly wind (Atkinson 1997).
