## **DETAILED DESCRIPTION**

Clump-forming bamboo, forming dense clumps but not running extensively. **Stems** usually  $3-5m \times 1-2$  cm diameter and at least some stems striped yellow and green; several branches at each node. **Culm sheaths** with black hairs that are soon shed (caducous). **Leaf-blade** linear-lanceoloate, 6-15 cm  $\times$  0.6-1.5 cm, glaucous, hairy underneath.
