BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Shrub to around 1m tall with many interlacing zig-zagging twigs bearing small narrow uneven leaves 5-15mm long and a dry thin-walled fruit enclosing 1-4 seeds covered by a papery shell. Twigs hairy. Leaves smooth or with a very uneven edge.
