BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Forms large clumps with dense rosettes; leaves grey-green, elongated, curved with hooked spines on margins . Yellow flowers on erect emergent spikes up to 2m tall

DISTRIBUTION

Minor garden escape by seed in NZ, with some establishment by off-sets to make larger clumps.

SIMILAR TAXA

Other Puya species. Many are smaller than P. chilensis and with pink, seagreen or blue flowers

FRUITING Dry capsules on tall branched spikes
