SIMPLIFIED DESCRIPTION

Early summer flowering; corolla cream with pale purple flush inside the tube, followed in mid-late summer by papery capsules with red-brown seeds.

FLOWER COLOURS

Cream, Purple

Open areas with dry well-drained soils, sand. Seed germinates freely around established plants.
