DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Evergreen tree to 20 metres in height, often becoming asymmetrical. The single trunk divides into several main branches above to form an open, round-topped crown. **Bark** is scaly, dark grey on the outside and redbrown inside. **Needles** bright green, 6–10 cm long, often curved or twisted and held together in pairs by a basal sheath about 1 cm long. **Buds** are covered by scales with fringed edges. **Cones** 5–11 \times 2.5–4 cm wide, reddish-brown in colour; they grow singly or in dense groups, hanging downwards on short stalks that bend backwards along the branch.

SIMILAR TAXA

Long needles in pairs. Cones hang down on a prominent thick stalk, and are arranged singly or in pairs.

Perennial. Seed is dispersed by wind.
