### **SIMILAR TAXA**

Similar to *Poa tonsa*, which has the hairs on the lemma extending only about 1/2 way towards the tip. The spikes of *P. lindsayi* are usually held futher above the leaves and on longer branchlets giving a more delicate appearance. The leaves of *P. tonsa* can also be folded in a similar fashion to *P. lindsayi*, but are wider and with a distinctly curved tip. The leaves of *P. lindsayi* are coloured green or brown, those of *P. tonsa* are frequently a glacuous-purple. Depauperate plants can be similar to *P. maniototo*, which has a very compact head and a large ligule (easily visible

to the naked eye).
