SIMILAR TAXA

Similar to *Poa lindsayi*, which has the hairs on the lemma extending further towards the tip. The spikes are usually held further above the leaves and on longer branchlets giving a more delicate appearance. The leaves of *P. tonsa* can also be folded in a similar fashion to *P. lindsayi*, but are wider and with a distinctly curved tip. The leaves of *P. lindsayi* are coloured green or brown, those of *P. tonsa* are frequently a glaucous-purple.

ETYMOLOGY

poa: Meadow grass

tonsa: Means shaved or smooth
