## **ETYMOLOGY**

**raoulia**: Named after Étienne Fiacre Louis Raoul (23 July 1815–30 March 1852) who was a French naval surgeon and naturalist. He published a book Choix de plantes de la Nouvelle-Zélande ("Selected plants of New Zealand") in 1846. The genus was named after him by Joseph Hooker. **hectorii**: Named after Sir James Hector, 19th century New Zealand geologist and botanist who was originally from Scotland
