BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Recognition in the field: a medium stature *Rytidosperma* with erect culms, crowded dark spikes and florets with very short awn. The hairs on the lemma are only in two tufts on the margin.

DISTRIBUTION

Endemic. New Zealand: South Island (east of the main divide south to Otago).

HABITAT

A species of dry lowland and montane grassland.

SIMILAR TAXA

Similar to larger plants of <u>Rytidosperma pumilum</u> (which shares its habitat) which has scattered hairs on the lemma between the tufts and the awn is not visible to the naked eye. Also similar to <u>R. buchananii</u> which has a long bent awn on the floret.
