DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Stems 0.3–1.2 m tall, erect but branching more than those of other foxtails. **Panicle** dense, 5–10 cm long, with one bristle at the base of each spikelet, rarely 2 or 3. **Bristles** barbed (Wax, Fawcett and Isely 1981), causing seed heads to stick to each other, like 'Velcro'.
