Coprosma rubra (a divaricating coprosma)	Dargaville; Taihape-Hunterville districts and from Gisborne southwards in eastern N.Is.; north and east South Island	
Coprosma virescens (a divaricating coprosma)	Taihape district; Gisborne to Cape Palliser in eastern N.Is.; eastern South Is.	
Coprosma wallii (a divaricating coprosma)	Erua, Taihape, south-east Wairarapa; north and east of South Is.	Declining
Hoheria angustifolia (narrow-leaved lacebark)	Dargaville; Gisborne and southwards in N.Is., mainly in east; eastern South Is.	
Korthalsella clavata (a dwarf mistletoe)	Rangataua (Ohakune), Paengaroa SR, Tikitiki Bush (Waiouru), L. Wairarapa; eastern South Island.	
Lagenifera petiolata (excluding L.montana) (a herbaceous daisy)	Ruahine Corner; South Island	
Melicytus flexuosus (leafless mahoe - a divaricating shrub)	Pureora, Erua, Taihape district, north and east of South Island	Declining
Melicytus flexuosus x M.lanceolatus (a hybrid mahoe)	Two plants in Paengaroa SR, not known elsewhere.	
Olearia gardneri (a divaricating tree daisy, endemic to the North Island)	Taihape district; near Wairoa & Masterton	Critically Endangered (c.75 plants in the wild)
Pittosporum obcordatum (heart-leaved kohuhu, a divaricating tree)	Kaitaia; Whangarei; Mataroa; Gisborne southwards in eastern N.Is; Catlins; Lake Manapouri; extinct near Akaroa	Recovering
Teucridium parvifolium (a divaricating shrub)	Scattered from near Kaitaia southwards, but very local; mainly in east of South Is.	Declining
Tupeia antarctica (pirita, a leafy mistletoe)	Scattered in North and South Islands, but becoming rarer (possum browsing)	Declining

**Notes:** About 240 indigenous vascular plant species, including 15 spp. of *Coprosma* (11 small-leaved). Abundant small-leaved, mostly divaricating shrubs (c.32 spp. divaricating including 6 spp. with divaricating juvenile stages, such as matai, kaikomako). Some central N.Is. subspecies of widespread plants (e.g. Volcanic Plateau forms of *Olearia virgata* [smaller-leaved], *Rubus cissoides* [narrower-leaved]). One tree of pahautea (mountain cedar), at perhaps the lowest altitude for the species in North Island.
