dichotoma: Forked or divided into pairs

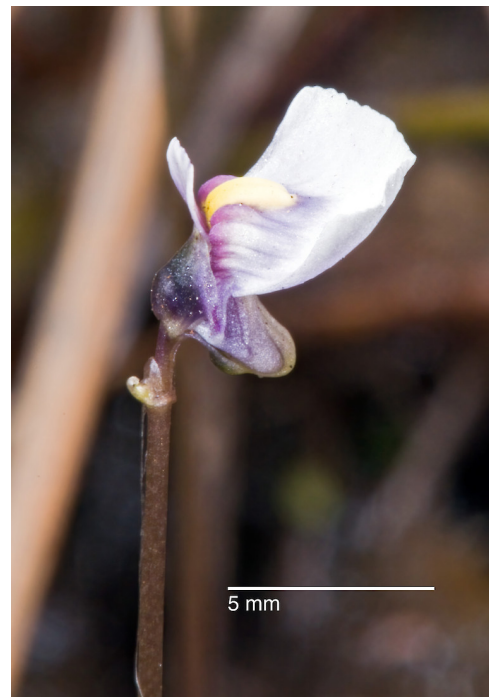
