HABITAT

Terrestrial: coastal dunes, foreshore, sandy places and waste land.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Perennial grass with stout rhizomes and very robust tufts to 150 cm. **Culm** stout and erect 50–110 cm tall. **Leaf-sheath** yellowish and almost glabrous. **Leaf-blade** 10–65 cm × 4.5–16 mm, strongly ribbed and almost glabrous. **Flowering spike** 25–40 cm stiff erect and tapered. **Seed** 6.5 × 2 mm.

SIMILAR TAXA

Can be separated from *L. arenarius* by the spikelets in clusters of 3-5, and the glumes without any hairs.

LIFE CYCLE

Reproduces by seed and rhizomes. Dispersed by wind.

This plant is named in a list of environmental weeds in New Zealand 2024 prepared by DOC. 759 candidate species were considered for inclusion on this new comprehensive list of environmental weeds in New Zealand. The species considered were drawn from published lists of weed species, lists of plants that must be reported or managed by law if observed, existing national and regional programmes and agreements for pest management, and species already managed by the Department of Conservation (DOC).
